Twelve is the highest grade  02 or higher
<b>Courses on Bachelor's and/or Master's level available for incoming exchange students</b>	Majority of courses taught in English are on MA/MSc level. Courses are assessed with different ECTS points. On each faculty's homepage you will find information about credits awarded for each course, allowing you to plan your academic year. Please note that we normally require students to be studying full-time (that is: taking 30 ECTS per semester)
<b>Student participation in research programmes possible</b>	Yes, after consulting the faculty or research group concerned
<b>Language requirements</b>	Proficiency in English or Danish depending on the courses chosen. Exchange students at AU are expected to have English language qualifications comparable to for example TOEFL test results of at least 560 (paper based test) or 83 (internet based test). IELTS test with a minimum score of 6.5 points.
<b>Language test certificate required</b>	Few institutes and one two faculties require a language test
<b>Housing assistance</b>	The International Centre offers housing service to all exchange students. <b>Health insurance/other insurances</b>	<b>Health Insurance</b> Students staying for more than 3 months are covered by the Danish Health Insurance after having received CPR-number (apply upon arrival). Students staying less than 3 months have to obtain a private health insurance before arriving to Denmark.  <b>Third Party Liability Insurance</b> It is the responsibility of the student to take out insurance (from home) for your personal belongings, accidents and third party liability while studying in Denmark. Aarhus University does not cover any losses that may occur.
