Professor Rauna Kuokkanen

Rauna Kuokkanen is Research Professor of Arctic Indigenous Studies at the University of Lapland, Finland, and Adjunct Professor of Indigenous Studies and Political Science at the University of Toronto, Canada. Her research focuses on comparative Indigenous politics and law, Indigenous feminist theory, Arctic governance and settler colonialism. Kuokkanen's recent book Restructuring Relations: Indigenous Self-Determination, Governance and Gender by Oxford University Press (2019) has been awarded with several prizes. The book is drawing on extensive interviews and political theory, and is an Indigenous feminist investigation of the concept of Indigenous self-determination, governance and gender regimes in Indigenous political institutions. https://rauna.net/

University lecturer Kristina Rolin

Kristina Rolin is a University lecturer from Tampere university. Her main area of research is philosophy of science, social epistemology and research ethics. She is interested in the role values in science - including social science, medicine, engineering, and scholarship in the humanities - epistemic injustice, trust, epistemic responsibility, and collective knowing. Professor emeritus Jeff Hearn

Jeff Hearn is Senior Professor / Professor Emeritus from Faculty of Humanities & Social Sciences, Human Geography University of Örebro and Hanken School of Economics. He is member of the Centre for Feminist Social Studies, and a founder member of the Centre for Violence Studies, and the Research Group on Critical Studies on Men and Masculinities. He is most known of his work on critical studies on men and masculinities, which he has advanced from the late 1970s. Hearn's other areas of interests include organisations, management and work, with special emphasis on gender, sexuality, diversity and intersectionality; violence and violations, especially men's violence to women and children; information society and ICTs; age and ageing; and comparative, international, global and transnational studies, including the implications of decoloniality/postcolonialism for 'centres' and the global North. https://www.oru.se/english/employee/jeff_hearn

Professor Firouz Gaini

Firouz Gaini is Professor in Anthropology and the Deputy Member of the Board of Directors of the University of the Faroe Islands. Gaini's main research focus is on young people's everyday lives and identities, as well as on their future perspectives and aspirations. His research interests include besides young people and youth cultures, fatherhood and masculinity, Anthropology of time and the Future and place and local identity. Most of his work is based on data from the Faroes, but he has also done fieldwork in Greenland (Nuuk), France (Nice) and Japan (Okinoshima Islands and Okinawa Islands). She is also scientific advisor for European Women Rectors' Association EWORA, and advisor for the Chalmers University of Technology 10-year Gender Equality Initiative GENIE. Husu's research interests focus on gender in science, academia and knowledge production; especially on gender dynamics and inequalities in scientific careers, organisations and science policy.
